TONIGHT'S GAME

◆**FIRST ROAD GAME:** The Tigers take to the road for the first time this season, traveling to Annapolis to face Navy in Alumni Hall. This is the 10th meeting between the two teams with the Tigers ahead in the series, 7-2. Towson is 3-1 against the Mids in Annapolis. Navy notched its first home win against the Tigers two years ago, winning 73-59. The Tigers got their revenge last year, handing the Mids an 86-68 loss to register their largest margin of victory in a season opener in 19 years. **Josh Thornton** scored a career high 24 points to lead the way. **Jarrel Smith**, making his Towson debut, tallied 18 points. **Calvin Lee**, in his first appearance as a Tiger after a two-year career at Allegany Community College, just missed a double-double with 10 points and 9 rebounds. Towson forced 18 Navy turnovers, coming up with 11 steals. The 86 points were the most for the Tigers in a win last year. Navy is the only Patriot League opponent on Towson's schedule this year.

HEAD COACH PAT KENNEDY:

The 2009-10 season is Pat Kennedy's 30th as a Division I head coach. He has never worked anywhere but at college basketball's highest level. Pat continues to rank among the top 25 active winningest Division I coaches with his 475 career victories, coming in at No. 21 before the start of the 2009-10 season. There isn't a level of Division I basketball he hasn't coached on, from the MAAC while at Iona, to the Metro Conference and Atlantic Coast Conference at Florida State, through Conference USA at DePaul to the Big Sky at Montana. He now finds himself directing Towson in the very competitive Colonial Athletic Association. He has taken teams to eight NCAA Tournaments and five NIT's. He has had ten 20-plus win seasons. He is the winningest coach in the Colonial Athletic Association, and the only coach to have prior head coaching experience in a major conference. Fifteen of the players he recruited have gone on to have NBA careers, including Sam Cassell from Baltimore's Dunbar H.S., most recently with the Los Angeles Clippers. Four of his former Towson players are currently playing overseas - Gary Neal, Junior Hairston, Lawrence Hamm and Marc Pratt. A number of his former assistants have become head coaches or assistants in the NBA. For over a decade Pat served on the National Association of Basketball Coaches board of directors. He was its president in 2004-05.

UPDATING TOWSON

◆**NO 2-0 START:** Buffalo spoiled the Tigers' hopes for just a third 2-0 start in the last 20 years when the Bulls escaped the Towson Center with a 78-69 win in overtime. Towson's two distinct cold shooting spells; one that was a costly start to the second half the other that occurred during the entire overtime period, allowed the Bulls to erase an 11-point deficit and eventually outscore the Tigers 13-4 in the extra session. The Tigers fell behind by nine points with 9:23 left to play but a late rally and a **Troy Franklin** three-pointer with 21 seconds left forced the overtime to decide the 65-65 tie. The Tigers missed all five field goals they attempted in the overtime while the Bulls connected on four of five from the floor and 5 of 7 from free throw line to gain the victory. Starting **Robert Nwankwo** did not play in the game (coach's decision). Franklin led the way with 17 points. **Calvin Lee** added 15 points and a team high 9 boards. **Jarrel Smith** registered 16 points and **Josh Thornton** chipped in 13.

◆**VERTIMERS:** The Tigers are now 12-22 in overtime games since joining the Division I ranks over three decades ago. Towson had won its previous overtime contest 82-72 last February against Georgia State but lost 103-98 to UNC Wilmington in late January. The loss to the Seahawks marked the first time in 153 games that an opponent had scored more than 100 points on the Tigers.

UPDATING THE MIDSHIPMEN

Navy enters tonight's game with a 1-3 record that includes a 63-56 loss in Alumni Hall to the same Buffalo Bulls that slipped out of the Towson Center with a 78-69 overtime win against Towson this past Saturday. Navy's lone win was a 79-76 contest at Longwood. The Midshipmen are coming off an 83-72 loss at Long Island. Starting point guard **O.J. Aworo** (8.0 ppg and a team high 17 assists) did not play at LIU due to an injury he suffered against Buffalo. Key reserve **T.J. Topercer** was also sidelined. Senior guard **Chris Harris** is leading the way with his 16.5 scoring average. An excellent free throw shooter (23 of 25 thus far) 23 of his total 66 points have come at the charity stripe. His backcourt mate, sophomore **Jordan Sugars**, is pitching in with 13.3 points per game. Sugars is also tough off the boards, leading Navy with a hefty 8.5 rebounding clip. A third guard, junior **Romeo Garcia**, is also in double figures with his 12.5 average. He's Navy's second leading rebounder with his 6.8 average.

DID YOU KNOW ...

◆◆◆ After their 82-71 loss to the Tigers in the Towson Center in the 2009-10 season opener for the both teams, the Miami RedHawks bowed to No. 4 Kentucky 72-70 in Rupp Arena. The game was tied with 4 seconds to play. The Wildcats scored on a buzzer beater to win it.

◆◆◆ The 86-68 win over Navy last year was the largest margin of victory for the Tigers in a season opener in 19 years, since Towson's 83-64 win over Howard in 1989.

◆◆◆ The Tigers will attempt to snap a 4-game road losing streak. Towson's last road win was a 69-56 victory over William & Mary in Williamsburg late last January. The Tigers have lost four out of their last five road openers, winning only at Samford (73-66) in 2007.

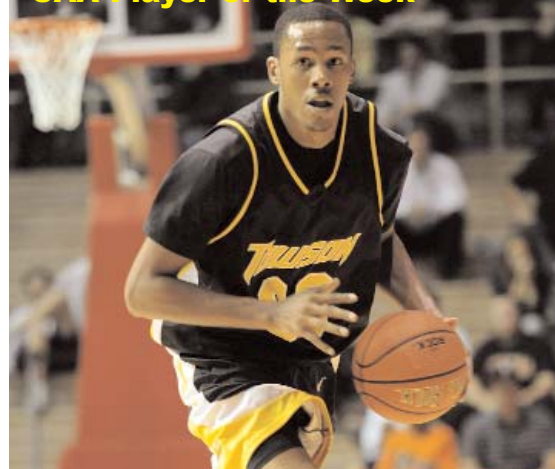
◆◆◆ The 2008-09 Tigers soared where no other Towson team had been - in the CAA semifinals. The 11th-seeded Tigers, who are the lowest seed in the history of the CAA Tournament to reach the semifinals, upset 3rd-seeded Northeastern 58-54 to claim their first ever quarterfinal victory since joining the CAA eight years ago.

◆◆◆ With their appearance in the CAA semifinals the Tigers played a record 34 games for the season. The previous record was 32 games in 2006-07 when Towson was 15-17 after beating UNC Wilmington 67-52 in the opening round of the CAA tournament before falling to ODU 58-55 in the quarterfinals.

◆◆◆ Towson's 15-0 start against 6th-seeded Drexel in the opening round of the CAA tourney last March was news enough but the Tigers' 39-14 lead at the half grabbed the headlines. That 25-point lead was Towson's largest since, oddly enough, the previous year when the Tigers led Hofstra 31-13 in a CAA opening round game. Towson went on to win that contest 81-66. The Tigers' 25-point lead over the Dragons turned out to be the largest lead of the 2009 CAA tournament.

◆◆◆ The Tigers employed 16 different starting lineups last season. No player started all 34 games. Jarrel Smith led the way with 32 starts followed by Troy Franklin with 30, Junior Hairston with 28 and Brian Morris with 22. Smith did not start in the home finale against Delaware because the Tigers started their five seniors. He was injured anyway, having suffered a shoulder sprain against Morgan State. The injury prevailed until the regular season finale at George Mason when Jarrel came off the bench and played just 16 minutes. Jarrel co-holds the program record for most starts in a season with Gary Neal (2006-07).

CALVIN LEE CAA Player of the Week



PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior forward Calvin Lee was named CAA Player of the Week after leading the Tigers to an 82-71 opening season victory over Miami (Ohio). Calvin scored a career high 25 points on 10 of 16 shooting from the floor. He was 5-7 from the free throw line, converting all four of his three-point opportunities. He also blocked 4 shots, grabbed 3 rebounds, had 1 assist and 1 steal (no turnovers) while playing a team and career high 37 minutes. Calvin's previous career scoring high was 13 points twice last year.

RECRUITS:

The Tigers have announced three early signings including 6-1 guard **Cephas Olgesby** (Cape Fear Community College/Cape Fear H.S./Fayetteville, N.C.), 6-11 forward **Jamel Flash** (West Hempstead H.S./West Hempstead, N.Y.) and 6-6 swing player **Damion Lee** (Calvert Hall H.S./Baltimore, Md.). Olgesby was ranked as the third best prospect among North Carolina junior college players after averaging 17.1 points to lead the Sea Devils to a 20-14 record that included a Region X Tournament championship and a trip to Hutchinson, Kan. for a spot in the NJCAA National Playoffs last year. A pre-season honorable mention NJCAA All-American selection this year, he also averaged 5.2 rebounds and 2.6 assists. Coming out of Cape Fear High School he was Cumberland County's second leading scorer with a 19.1 average. Flash's first exposure to organized basketball came in his freshman year at West Hempstead. A two-year team captain, he averaged 12.2 points, 10.4 rebounds and 3.1 blocks in his junior year when the Rams were 12-0 in conference play and 15-5 overall. He has registered single game career highs of 21 points, 19 rebounds and seven blocks. Lee is the latest signee. He averaged 11.0 points and 7.0 rebounds for the Cardinals last year, helping Calvert Hall to a 30-7 record. Joining the three signees is junior forward **Braxton Dupree**, a former All-Metro and All-Conference center from Calvert Hall who is transferring from Maryland where he played as a freshman and sophomore, appearing in 52 games with 14 starts.

TIGERS IN THE TOWSON CENTER:

The Towson Center is in its 4th decade, celebrating its 33rd anniversary. Towson has compiled a 264-174 (.611) record there. The longest winning streak is 22 from January 11, 1993 to January 7, 1995. The longest losing streak is 6 from January 29, 2005 to November 19, 2005. The Tigers currently have a 1-game losing streak. Towson won the first 12 games to open the Towson Center. Top streaks are:

TOMORROW'S TOWSON CENTER:

Towson University continues to plan the construction of a new arena attached to the current Towson Center that will become the new home of the men's women's basketball program and provide a new location for major university events like graduation and convocations. Construction on the new 5,000-seat arena is expected to begin in the fall of 2010 and open for the 2012-13 season. The Arena will be attached to the current Towson Center. The front entrance will be just off of Auburn Drive, across from the Johnny Unitas Stadium press box. The Arena will feature a seating bowl, hospitality areas and suites. The concourse will include four concessions areas, ticketing and a Hall of Fame exhibit where the university plans to display a history of its athletics program. The project also includes enhancement of the lower level of the Towson Center, including renovation to the basketball and visiting locker rooms, and expansion of the strength and conditioning facilities.

The Tigers are back on the road when they travel to Dayton to meet the Flyers this Saturday in the 5th meeting between the two schools. Dayton is ahead in the series 3-1. The two teams last met in 1993 when the Tigers escaped Dayton Arena with a 72-70 upset. The Tigers finished the 1993-94 season with a 21-9 record, their only 20-win season as a Division I program. Towson began that season with a 66-65 upset of St. John's in the Pre-Season NIT. At Dayton Scooter Alexander scored 23 points that included the game winning jumper with 10 seconds remaining. Ralph Blalock added 21 points for Towson, making 11 of 13 free throws. This is actually the Tigers' 6th trip to Dayton Arena. Towson opened the 1990-91 season with a 99-79 loss to the host Flyers and closed the campaign with a 97-86 loss to Ohio State in an NCAA Tourney game. Dayton is the first of three Atlantic 10 teams on Towson's roster. The Tigers host George Washington on December 12th and return a game at St. Joseph's on January 18th.

TIGERS 82, Miami (Ohio) 71

TOWSON, Md. - Calvin Lee scored a career high 25 points as host Towson got its 2009-10 campaign off on a positive note when the Tigers handed Miami (Ohio) an 82-71 loss in the season opener for both teams.

The Tigers, winning their lid lifter for a fourth straight year, clawed their way back from two deficits. Troy Franklin's three-point play at the 13:34 mark of the second period capped a 17-9 run that put the Tigers out front, 54-51. Towson held the advantage the rest of the way, leading by as many as 14 points late.

"We feel we can score more this year than last year when we averaged around 65 points," Tiger head coach Pat Kennedy said. "Our shot selection in the second half was very good."

Towson shot 52.6 per cent for the game. The RedHawks were 55.2 per cent from the field in the first half when they grabbed a 42-37 lead at the break but cooled to 39 per cent in the final period.

The RedHawks built a 10-point lead (18-8) early. The Tigers spent most of the first half erasing the deficit, assuming a 33-32 lead with 3:40 left in the period on David Brewster's three-pointer. But Miami got the advantage right back when Kenny Hayes, the RedHawks top scorer with 17 points, buried a trey that beat the shot clock. Miami closed the half with a 12-4 run for the 42-37 lead.

The RedHawks bolted to a nine point lead (46-37) to start the second half but Towson's 17-9 run put the Tigers on top the rest of the way.

Lee was the only Towson player in double figures but all nine Tigers who saw 14 or more minutes of action scored at least four points. Brian Morris and Franklin combined for 15 assists.

"My teammates believe in me and kept giving me the ball," said Lee who was 10 of 16 from the floor and 5-7 from the free throw line. "I was able to finish a lot of the plays."

BUFFALO 78, TIGERS 69 (ot)

TOWSON, Md. - A couple of cold shooting spells, one in the overtime, let Buffalo slip out of the Towson Center with a 78-69 overtime win, dashing the Tigers' hopes for just their third 2-0 start in the last 20 years.

"I thought we made a nice comeback today, but our offense was sluggish at times," Towson Coach Pat Kennedy said. "I thought we played well on defense at times, but we gave up too many points."

Led by nine Troy Franklin points, the Tigers built a 33-27 halftime lead and were up by as many as 11 before the game went south for Towson.

The Bulls started the second half with an 11-0 run to take a 38-33 advantage with 16:53 remaining in the stanza. However, the Tigers had a response of their own by scoring seven of the next nine points to even the score at 40-40 with 14:57 remaining.

After the Bulls had built their largest lead of the second half with 9:21 remaining, the Tigers began to rally back and trailed by 65-62 with 1:18 remaining on a lay-up by sophomore Calvin Lee. With 33 seconds left in regulation, the Tigers forced Buffalo to commit a shot clock violation to gain possession and set up the potential game-tying shot.

Josh Thornton set a screen for Franklin at the top of the key, which allowed him to nail a three-pointer with 19.6 seconds left to send the game into overtime.

After Towson took a 68-67 advantage with 3:49 left in the extra period on a Jarrel Smith free throw, the Bulls put the game out of reach by outscoring Towson 11-1 over the final three minutes.

Franklin showed the way for the Tigers with 17 points off the bench, making 7 of 14 shots from the floor. Smith added 16 points and seven rebounds while Lee contributed 15 points with nine rebounds.

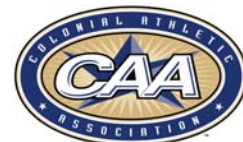
